Where is your hope, entering 2021? Is it in the blank canvas of a calendar or planner, because you are more than ready to put the number 2020 behind you? Is it in your New Year's resolutions for personal and/or business growth for the next twelve months? These tools can be helpful but, ultimately, they are like building your foundation on the sand.

Or is your hope rooted in the same source as it was on December 31, 2019, when you had very little idea of what the year 2020 might bring? For believers young and old, our constant hope ought to be in the Everlasting Father and Prince of Peace throughout the year (Isaiah 9:6 is not only for Christmas!). Build your foundation for the upcoming 365 days on the rock-Jesus.

One of my father's favorite hymns is "The Solid Rock," and it has become a favorite of mine, too. I was intrigued to learn the history behind the author, Edward Mote, particularly because his story can be traced back to his childhood. He was born in 1797 to parents who were not religious. Edward Mote said this of his upbringing: "So ignorant was I that I did not know there was a God. My Sundays were spent on the streets (of London) in play."

As I read this man's story, I could not help but think of children in our county who we meet in parks and on sidewalks in the summers when we go inviting for 5-Day Clubs because they are left on their own ... and children during the school year (pre-coronavirus) whose parents sign them up for After School Good News Clubs so they stay occupied for an extra hour away from home. This is not representative of all families we interact with in a typical year, but I suspect it is true of more than a few.

However, what happened to Edward Mote, that he went from a boy playing in the streets to a pastor writing a hymn that resounds with solid doctrine? The cabinetmaker, for whom he apprenticed as a teenager, took him to church. As a result, Mote heard the Gospel and received Jesus as his Saviour from sin. Later, he became a pastor and served for more than twenty years. He penned "The Solid Rock" in 1834.

> "My hope is built on nothing less Than Jesus' blood and righteousness; I dare not trust the sweetest frame, But wholly lean on Jesus' name. On Christ, the solid Rock, I stand; All other ground is sinking sand, All other ground is sinking sand."
